StATUSA is using its Human Advocate Program to provide women in jail with knowledge and resources so that they have a better chance of breaking the cycles of incarceration, substance abuse, and sexual exploitation in their lives. We are doing this by running group sessions that help these ladies learn important life skills and educate them about trauma and sex trafficking related issues.

Our Human Advocate Program also offers individual sessions to incarcerated survivors of sexual exploitation. These sessions provide survivors with trauma-informed Community Support. Giving Community Support allows our Human Advocates to listen to the individual needs and dreams of survivors in jail. Advocates can then pray with them, encourage them, give them psycho-educational material, and help link them to community resources based on their needs and life goals. This type of Community Support is an important part of helping these ladies find hope and healing in their lives so that they have a greater opportunity to break free from patterns of negative life choices that result from exploitation.

Every Person Matters

Our first priority in the Human Advocate Program is to create a safe and supportive environment that encourages the women we work with to learn and heal. We believe that each person, no matter their past, should be treated with dignity and respect. Above all else, our staff and volunteers aim to show these ladies the unconditional love and grace of Christ in order to help them realize that they matter because God made each of them with purpose and worth to offer the world.
